Love Gift to ACS (I) on Founder's Day 2023

Anglo-Chinese School (ACS) was founded by Methodist Bishop William Fitzjames Oldham in 1886 to nurture students to be of service “for God and Humanity”. ACS (Independent) has a strong foundation in spiritual values, a tradition of excellence and a global perspective. The core purpose of the school remains to nurture ACSians to be catalysts for change with Godly values and robust character, equipped and willing to serve and lead in the family, nation and the global community. The school’s mission is “to be a world-class institution, a beacon of truth and light, through the holistic development of our students”.

Preaching Point at ACS (I) was established on 12 April 1998, under the leadership of Rev Dr Norman Wong, then Pastor-In-Charge of Barker Road Methodist Church. Five years later, we became Living Waters Methodist Church (LWMC).

Through the years, LWMC has worked in close partnership with ACS (I) to reach out to students, staff and families of the school, as well as students from the region staying at the boarding school. With students of different nationalities represented in the school, LWMC is uniquely positioned to reach people of different nationalities. ACS (I) is our mission field at our doorstep.



The current Honour Rolls were a gift from Barker Road Methodist Church as an expression of her partnership with ACS since 1956. The honour rolls are a reminder of God's faithfulness to His people and celebrate students' and alumni's achievements in Academic Excellence, Strength of Character and Christian Service. ACS also remembers ACSians who made the supreme sacrifice in service. It also lists our Bishops and the school's roots with the Methodist Church.

Next year, the school plans to refresh these Honour Rolls. Living Waters Methodist Church leadership has decided to partner with the school in providing a new set of Honour Rolls to ACS (I) on Founders' Day 2023.

This project is estimated to cost \$20,000. The church will give \$5,000, and we request that church members consider giving the additional \$15,000 to this cause. If collections exceed the required amount for this project, the balance will be channelled to a designated fund for ACS(I) Ministry use. ACS Honour Roll

Introduction

- To celebrate ACS 137th Founder's Day in 2023, ACS (Independent) would be unveiling the ACS Honour Roll.
- The purpose of the Honour Roll is to provide recognition of students' academic achievements.
- In addition, the Honour Roll is a means of recognizing ACSians for their various contributions and accomplishments to public service and sports.
- Lastly, the Honour Roll remembers and honours ACSians who have sacrificed their lives for Singapore during peacetime and war.
- The estimated cost of this project is \$20,000.

Structure



The structure would be a metal outdoor plaque with a brushed aluminium curved base. As aluminium alloys contain almost no iron, it will not rust.

The finished plaque would be made using high-grade plexi glass or acrylic for the purpose of durability.

For lettering, it will be UV printing or sticker cut out to standardize font size, type and colour.

There will be in total **eight** plaques and they will be placed outside the school's front office.

On each plaque, a metal etching (rust-proof) of a building which is associated with the history of ACS would be placed on top.






